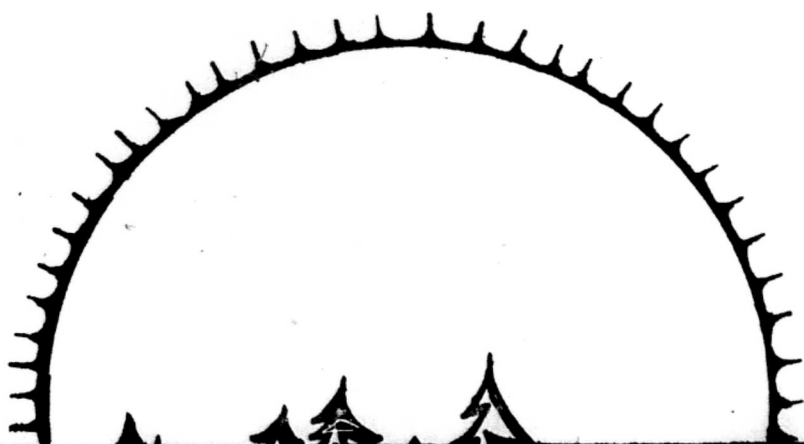

An emergency aid scholarship program is now available to American Indians and Alaska Native college students. The Association of American Indian Affairs (AAIA) in New York City can provide students with emergency money when they have no other source. "For the student with a sixty (60) mile daily commute to campus who suddenly develops car trouble, \$100.00 to repair the car can mean the difference between continuing in school or having to give it up," says Executive Director Steven Unger. AAIA, in its regular scholarship program, provided grants to approximately 100 students last year. This new program will provide dozens of additional applicants with grants of up to \$300.00 for emergency educational needs. Although the program does not cover major educational costs, it does fulfill a critical need, says Unger. The AAIA is a private, non-profit, national citizen's organization that assists American Indian and Alaska Native communities throughout the nation in their efforts to achieve full economic, social and civil equality. Eligible students may apply for emergency aid by writing to the Association at 95 Madison Avenue, NYC, 10016.

The Harbor Springs Historical Commission has won a Certificate of Commendation for producing the exhibit and catalogue, "Ottawa Quillwork on Birchbark".  
..... conferred the award at its annual

The American Association for State and Local History conferred the award at its annual meeting in Louisville, KY. The association's awards program is the nation's most prestigious competition for local history achievement.

A national selection committee, composed of leaders in the history profession, reviewed 157 nominations. Thirty-six [36] awards of merit and sixty-seven [67] certificates of commendation were awarded to individuals, institutions, and historical organizations across the United States and Canada.

Nominations originate at the local level and are screened at the state and regional levels by a national network of judges. Only those nominations approved in these preliminary competitions are considered for national honors.

In this exhibit, one-hundred and fifty [150] pieces of Ottawa quillwork on birchbark was featured, a portion of which came on loan from the Austrian National Historical Museum in Vienna and other work from the Southwest Museum in Los Angeles, The Little Traverse Regional Historical Museum in Petoskey and from private collections.

## INDIAN WOMEN PROFESSIONALS

The American Indian woman, in both historical and contemporary context, is viewed in the national consciousness as a single subservient role, without regard for diversity of roles of women of the past in some 300 distinct functioning societies, nor little known achievements of today's Native woman.

Characteristics surface in a newly released Census Report which should lay to rest the "squaw" image stereotype of today's Indian woman.

The report on 1980 labor force participation shows that 355 Indian women are Doctors and Lawyers and research has counted 65 women who are elected heads of tribal governments.

Significantly, Indian women according to the census report, outdistance the general population in male-female ratio in professional entry. 33% of Indian physicians are women, compared to 16% of the U.S. total population. 11% of Indian dentists are women, compared to 7% in total population.

Trends established over the years indicate that Indian women, once they have acquired education and professional training, tend to use their knowledge to promote a more active involvement of American Indians in their fields and to return to their communities, whether urban or reservation, to serve their people.

### COURT RULES AGAINST TRIBE'S EFFORTS TO LEGALIZE PROSTITUTION.....

The Ninth Circuit Court ruled November 15th against the Moapa Tribe's efforts to legalize prostitution on the reservation in Nev. The court affirmed the disapproval of a tribal ordinance by Interior's Assistant Secretary for Indian Affairs Ken Smith. Smith argued that approving the ordinance would have been acting contrary to federal policy and the court supported that argument as a legitimate basis for disapproval of the ordinance.

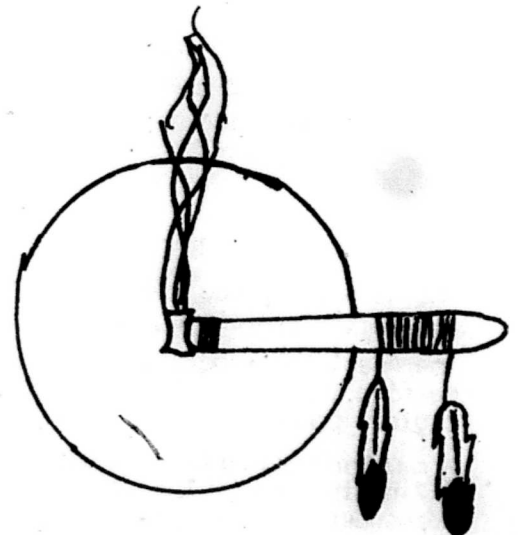

A hot lunch is served at 12:00 noon, Monday thru Friday and transportation is provided to and from the center. Other services include: Counseling, grocery shopping, focus hope deliveries, and home visits to our shut-in/isolated seniors. Referrals are made for chore service, employment, health screening, social services, emergency food, legal assistance, minor home repair, college assistance, mental health, substance abuse, housing assistance and tax assistance. Social and recreational activities include: field trips, games, special occasion events, movies, speakers and exercise program.

The seniors program funding is from the Detroit Area Agency on Aging and Food and Friendship. The NAIA has no other funding source for this program and therefore the seniors in the program have various fund-raising activities. 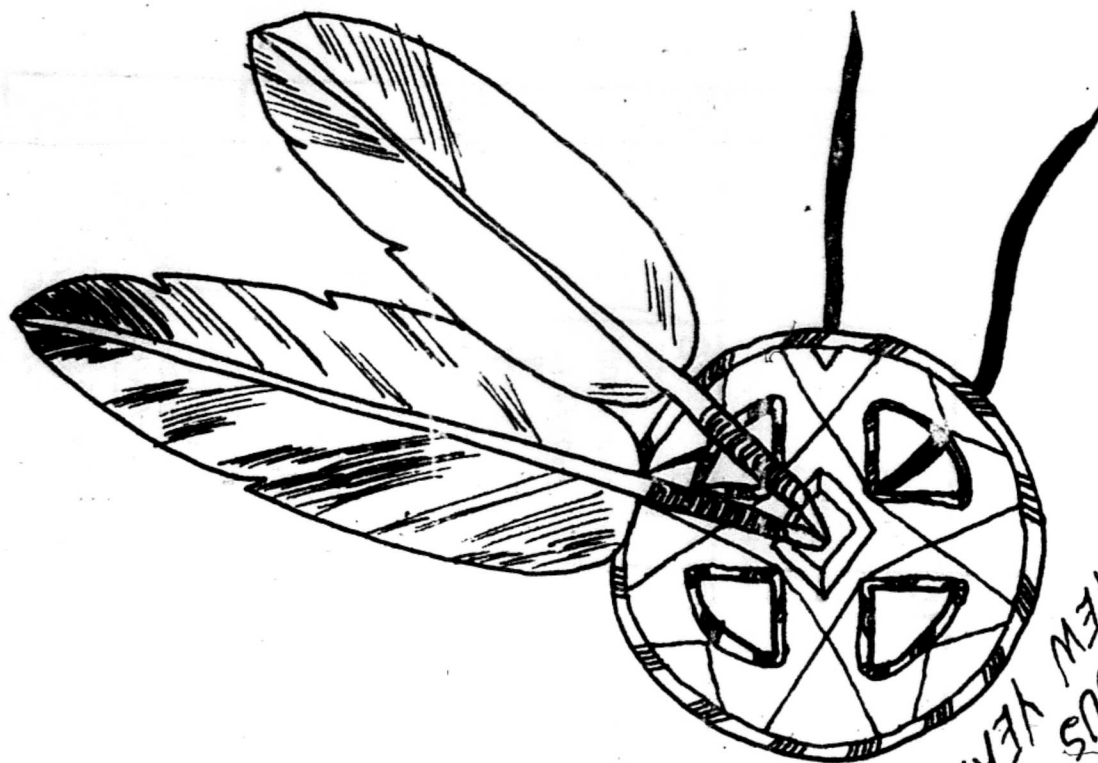
