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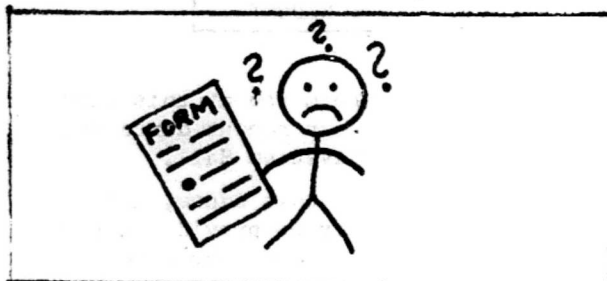

STUDENT AIDE FOR STUDENT AID

ARE YOU CONFUSED about those long forms for financial aid that ask a lot of questions? DO YOU KNOW that there is MONEY AVAILABLE to attend school for higher education? If you will fill out a financial aid form (FAF) and send it in, you may be eligible for GRANTS and LOANS FROM FEDERAL AND STATE GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS. The money is there for you!!!

There is also help in filling out the financial aid forms. D'Etre Institute is sponsoring a FINANCIAL AID FORM-FILLING-OUT SESSION at 7:30 p.m. on November 30th at the Stout School in Dearborn. There will be a person there (ask for Janice Deer) who can answer your questions. If you will be a student at ANY college or university in the school year 83-84, it is IMPORTANT THAT YOU HAVE THE FORM RIGHT AWAY. Grants are given out according to need and on a first-come, first-serve basis. This session is FREE and open to any North American Indian student who would like to attend.

You can also see what D'Etre Institute is about while you are there. Briefly, D'Etre is a school of higher education with a student enrollment of Native Americans only.

IF YOU CANNOT MAKE IT TO THIS SESSION, you can contact me in the Manpower dept. at 963-0126 and I will be able to help you with the form or forms. REMEMBER, there is MONEY AVAILABLE to help you FURTHER YOUR EDUCATION!!!!

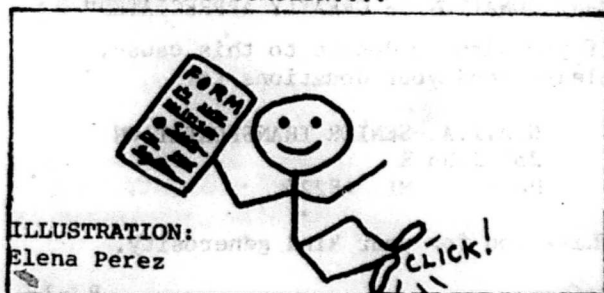

ARE YOU JUST SITTING AROUND COLLECTING DUST??

Did you know that YOU, (YES, YOU!) could be attending college and obtaining a degree in the area of your choice? A college education is obtainable for anyone who wants to get out of the rut that they are in.... IT IS TRUE!!!! Many students and clients that come into the Center have a lot of misconceptions regarding college. Hopefully, I can clear up those "outdated notions". Here are just a few of the questions that are most often asked about college.

Q: I HAVE MY G.E.D.; DON'T YOU HAVE TO HAVE A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA BEFORE THEY LET YOU INTO COLLEGE?

A: NO! A G.E.D. IS ACCEPTABLE IN ORDER TO GAIN ENTRANCE TO A COLLEGE. AND SOME JUNIOR COLLEGES ALLOW STUDENTS THAT DO NOT HAVE EITHER ONE TO ATTEND CLASSES AS GUESTS, DEPENDING UPON THE SCHOOL AND THE PROGRAM.

Q: DON'T YOU HAVE TO BE "SMART" IN ORDER TO GO TO COLLEGE?

A: SMART??? HIGHER EDUCATION WILL ALLOW YOU TO OBTAIN KNOWLEDGE AND LEARNING, ALTHOUGH I SHOULD SAY THAT MOST COLLEGES REQUIRE THE STUDENT TO MAINTAIN A "C" AVERAGE OR BETTER. THE STUDENT MUST REMAIN IN GOOD STANDING GRADE-WISE TO FULFILL HIS/HER SCHOLASTIC FINANCIAL AID REQUIREMENTS.

Q: DON'T YOU HAVE TO HAVE MONEY TO GO TO COLLEGE?

A: NO. THERE WAS A TIME WHEN THAT WAS TRUE, BUT NOT TODAY. THERE ARE MANY FORMS OF FINANCIAL AID AVAILABLE TO INDIANS. YOU CAN GET HELP THROUGH YOUR TRIBE, THE BUREAU OF INDIAN AFFAIRS, AND THE TUITION WAIVER PROCESS, JUST TO NAME A FEW OF THE MANY GRANTS AVAILABLE.

If you are interested in attending school, or would like more information about going to college, give us a call in the Manpower Department, or stop by, and we will try to help you in any way that we can. Just call 963-0126 and ask for Jan or Linda.

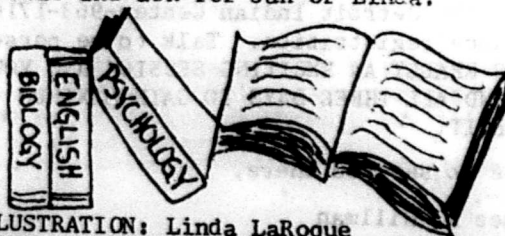

... EDITORIAL PAGE ...

I am just as community-oriented as most ANISHNABES that I have come into contact with, and yet, I have never listened to the radio program, INDIAN TO INDIAN, since the change was made from Wednesday nights to Sunday nights!! Many of the people that I have spoken with have also expressed a deep dis-satisfaction with the change in the schedule. The Wednesday night program slot was much more satisfactory, and for several reasons.

First, INDIAN TO INDIAN came on at an hour that was compatible with the time schedule of parents who have young children. The children could listen to the program and practice their Pow-Wow steps quite happily and without getting tired, because the original time schedule was at 7:30 P.M.

Also, INDIAN TO INDIAN was, on Wednesdays, an hour-long program. Now, on Sundays, it has been cut to only a half-hour program, and that is not nearly enough! We do have our community concerns, and they deserve to be addressed, and they WERE being taken care of by the radio show host, LINDA LAROQUE. Linda is good, but it is not humanly possible to condense comments that should take an hour into a half-hour time schedule!! Plus, Linda is always very careful to allow adequate time to the Pow-Wow music segment of the show.

Now, due to the half-hour time slot, it is placing a great degree of difficulty on Linda to expect her to somehow present the Indian Community with an hour's worth of information in the half-hour time frame. As a result, we, the audience, are being short-changed. Linda didn't do it. The change of schedule did it to us. IT IS TIME TO REGISTER A PROTEST TO THE RADIO STATION!!!!

PLEASE WRITE TO THEM! If you think, as I do, that the Wednesday night hour-long show was better for meeting the needs of the Indian Community, tell the man that and give him reasons why! Address your letters to:

I have been an active member of the Indian community for a couple of years now. From time to time, I like to sit back and evaluate situations. I am sorry to say that this time around during my evaluation process, I was quite sad and disappointed.

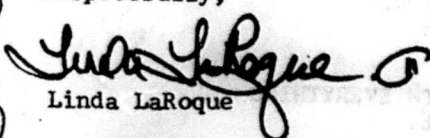

- ...that Washington D.C., Winnebago, Nebraska and Juneau, Alaska WERE CLOSER than they are????!!!!



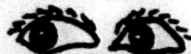

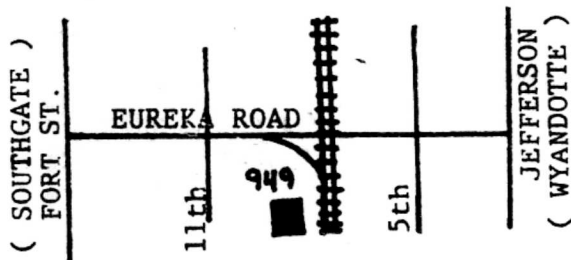
