

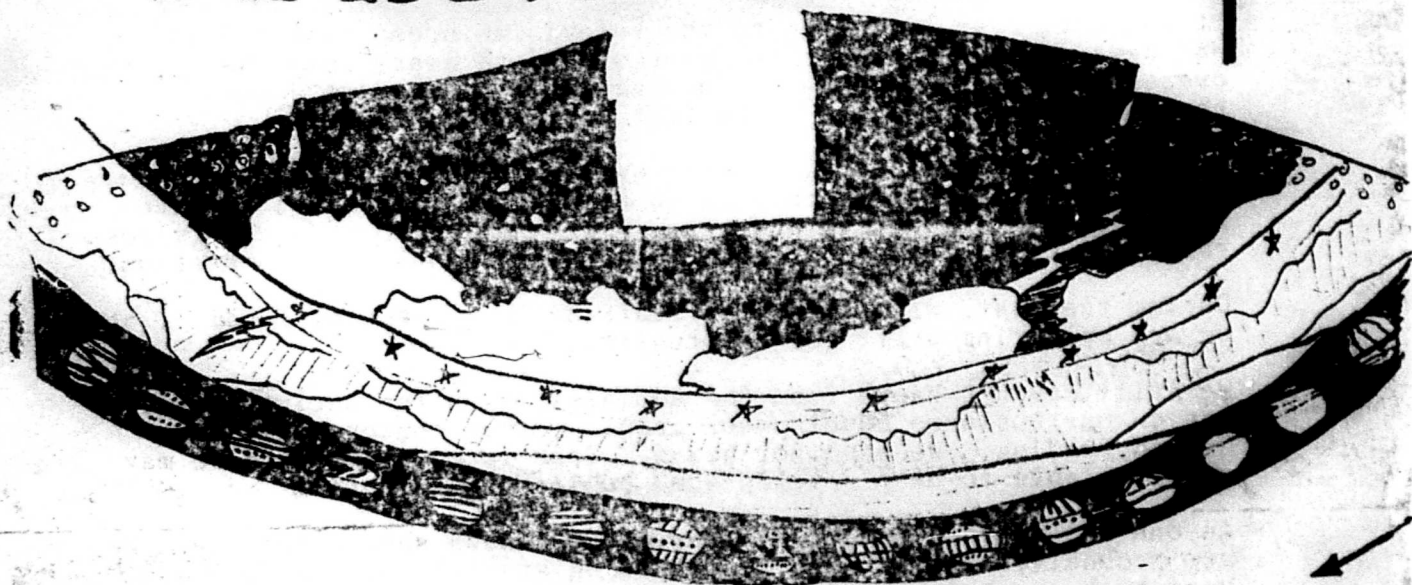

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

If you have been listening to the television press conferences and news releases in the past months you are aware that the overall reduction of federal funding for all programs across the country is beginning to be felt in Indian Centers.

Here at the Detroit Indian Center we are in the process of downsizing our operations according to the grants remaining. We are not closing the center. However, we are having to reduce services that many people have considered essential such as transportation.

During the year, we will reduce staff as we run out of funding, and we are preparing staff for eventualities now.

We still haven't heard from the Administration for Native Americans yet on our business development grant. Other centers have been denied funding. We have not heard. That is good news and we may still be able to help develop some businesses this fall.

Anyone who wants to start his/her own business should call me. We are probably 6 months away from getting started, but we at least need to know who's interested in businesses.

Don't forget to come to the center during the last of September and register to vote. Ask at the front desk for registration forms. Election of officers is to be held Sunday, October 3rd, 1982 at the center between 4-6 p.m.

Al-Fassi said he would invest an additional \$1.5 million in an Indian housing project in Minnesota, but only if actor Brando visited him at his home in Miami, Means said.

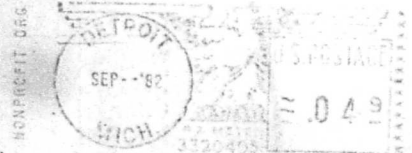
